Please join us for the 2022 Dairy Forum that will be held March 15-17 at the JW Marriott Desert Ridge in Phoenix, Arizona. (Note: this is a different location from the original save-the-date.)

As your state, regional, national and international checkoff organizations continue their hard work to advance farmer priorities and strategies that help maintain and grow sales and trust in dairy for today and in the future, your participation in our annual forum is more important than ever.

The 2022 Dairy Forum offers a unique opportunity to bring farmers together from across the country to better understand the mindset of today's consumers – both in the United States and around the world – and what those insights can mean for dairy. At the Forum, you will hear from expert guest speakers, along with checkoff farmer and executive leaders who will share how we leverage insights to build out the strategies that drive sales and build trust for dairy and dairy farmers.

The meeting kicks off Tuesday afternoon at 2 p.m. MST with an opening general session that features research expert Jason Dorsey who will help us understand and learn how to engage with the next generation of consumers. This session also includes an interactive portion that will explore what this means for dairy.

Following an opening reception on Tuesday evening, attendees will reconvene Wednesday morning for a general session featuring DMI CEO Barbara O'Brien and other checkoff leaders who will lay out how the checkoff works to address these insights and trends. The remainder of the day will feature a series of rotations where attendees can experience for themselves the programs and initiatives that are driving results today, including:

- Building trust with the next generation of consumers
- Driving sales and demand in the United States and globally
- Using research and education to position U.S. dairy as a critical part of a global food system

Thursday morning kicks off with a working breakfast for farmers from across the country to share what they learned throughout the General Session and rotations and offer their perspectives. Following these small group sessions, attendees will gather for a final General Session to report what was discussed, followed by a wrap up that showcases what we've learned – and what we all can do now to help advance a better future for dairy. The Forum will adjourn at 11 a.m. MST.

Additional Information | Overview of Travel Expenses Covered
